Dear SSPRPA Members,

The 2021-2022 SSPRPA year was a great success and one that everyone can be proud of. When we reflect back on this year, one word resonates more than others, and that is growth. As an Association and professionals in Parks and Recreation, we have grown in numerous ways over the last year. The board, committee chairs/co-chairs and the membership, as a whole, worked together to achieve so much during a time of continued uncertainty from the COVID-19 mitigations and staffing shortages at our agencies. Here are some highlights and accomplishments from this past year:

After 18 months of Zoom meetings, we were finally able to come together in-person for our September Social at the Odyssey Sweet Spot in Tinley Park. In November, we hosted the first of two Leadership Series Workshops with Bobbie Nance at the Palos Heights Parks and Recreation Center. The Executive Board was successful in obtaining a \$1,500 education grant through IPRF to fund the Leadership Series. In December, the social committee planned a great social at the Alley Grill & Taphouse in Mokena where the Diversity Committee collected Blessing Bags for the Crisis Center of South Suburbia. Through your generosity, we collected \$1,465 in gift cards and two carloads of toys and clothing that we were able to donate. Additionally, we hosted the IPRA Road Show in December.

January marked the return of our social at the IPRA State Conference. In February, the Student Committee, put on another successful virtual Student Meeting and the Legislative Committee hosted a wonderfully attended Legislative Breakfast. March brought us our 2nd Leadership Series workshop and the ability for districts to return to Springfield for the IAPD Legislative Reception and Conference.

In April, the Awards Committee put together an amazing ceremony and presentation to honor those professionals that have gone above beyond this year, to showcase the successes of our member agencies and wish the best of luck to those professionals leaving the field. The Social Committee put together another great event at Khaos Brewcade for our closing social and in the summer months, the Day Camp Workshop Committee and Early Childhood Committee hosted two fantastic workshops for seasonal and part-time staff.

In addition to all of these highlights, the executive board worked with John Wilson to bring the Wilson Family Public Servant Fund to SSPRPA, which will award the Young Professional of the Year a \$500 education voucher. A special thank you goes to the Wilson Family for their generous contribution and continued support of South Suburban and its members. With the addition of the \$500 voucher to the Young Professional of the Year, the board agreed to fund a matching \$500 voucher to the Professional of the Year recipient. Spearheaded by our Treasurer, Jason Braglia, the Board worked to officially become a recognized 501(C)3 and the Strategic Plan Committee continued their work on updating the Associations Strategic Plan.

A big thank you to every one of our members for all of the hard work this past year! We are looking forward to continued growth and success, as well as working with all of our members to continue to achieve our mission







Strategy 1

Strategy 2

Provide orientation and training for committee chairs to help provide structure to committee operations.

- Create and schedule Board and Committee chair retreat
 - o Review and update operations manual
 - Introduce and train chairs and new board members on the budget process
 - Review and train proper financial procedures
 - Schedule committee meetings for the year to combine and or prevent duplication of meetings and content
 - Review with chairs the importance of reports at meetings
- Create committee intent categories on memberships registration forms so that information can be sent to members based on their interest
 - Start strategy 2 summer of 2018, making improvements each year.

Strategy 3

Offer efficient and effective meetings that provide useful learning opportunities and networking for members.

- Continue to provide professional speakers and programs that provide relevant topics
- Require all board, chairs, and speakers to stand so that all members can hear them during the meeting
- Inform members in advance when CEU programs will extend the overall length of a meeting
- Start all meetings on time
- Provide nametags at meetings so that members can learn each other's names easier
- Assign members to tables periodically to encourage members to network with others that are not from their agency
- Continue to offer general meetings at different locations and search for new facilities to host
- Continue to offer lunch at meetings
- Educate members on the availability of using the announcement portion of general meetings for the benefit of the membership or their agency.
